Keeping Safe: Learning About Personal Boundaries

As part of our ongoing commitment to student wellbeing and safety, our teachers deliver the Keeping Safe: Child Protection

Curriculum throughout the year. This term, classes have been focusing on the important concept of personal boundaries.

Understanding boundaries is a key part of developing respectful and healthy relationships. Students have been learning that boundaries help us understand what is okay and not okay in how we treat others—and how we expect to be treated in return. They've also been encouraged to speak up when something doesn't feel right, using phrases like "I don't like that" or "Please stop, that's too rough."

In our lessons, we've supported students to:

- · Recognise their own personal space and body boundaries
- Practise saying 'no' or 'stop' when they feel uncomfortable
- Understand and respect the boundaries of others
- · Trust their feelings—if something doesn't feel right, they should tell a trusted adult

How You Can Help at Home: As parents and caregivers, you play a vital role in reinforcing these messages. You can support your child by:

- · Talking openly about what is okay and not okay when it comes to touch and personal space
- · Modelling respectful behaviour and listening when your child sets a boundary
- Using "what if" scenarios to help your child think through how they might respond in different situations
 (e.g. "What if someone hugs you and you don't like it?")

By helping children understand and practise setting boundaries now, we are equipping them with lifelong skills to keep themselves and others safe.


