From the Principal

Dear Families,

As the iconic song by Crowded House states "Everywhere you go always take the weather with you" a fitting reflection of the fantastic attitude of our students who participated in water safety week. Although the actual weather was cold, the students dressed appropriately and stayed warm as they participated in learning valuable life skills about water safety.

Unfortunately, due to the ongoing refurbishment of the Adelaide Aquatic Centre and changes in school access to The Parks facility, our school was allocated a less-than-ideal timeslot. Although this timing was not optimal, it was the only slot available to us and given the importance of water safety education—particularly for our Reception students, many of whom were experiencing a swimming pool for the first time—we made the decision to proceed with the program. We felt it was essential that all students had the opportunity to participate in these vital lessons, in line with the needs of our community.

Looking ahead, we have already submitted our booking preferences for 2026 and are hopeful that we will be allocated a timeslot during the warmer months.

This term has seen a variety of excursions that have enriched classroom learning—thank you to all the staff and volunteers who made these possible. We have more exciting outings planned, with R/1s going to The Botanic Gardens and Year 2 heading to The Planetarium.

You may notice the use of the following acronyms in your child's report:

AAS (Alternate Achievement Standard): This means your child has been taught their year level curriculum with adjustments, but has been assessed and reported against the achievement standard of a different year level.

HPC (Highly Personalised Curriculum): This indicates your child has engaged in a highly individualised curriculum for one or more subjects and has been assessed and reported using the General Capabilities of the Australian Curriculum.

These adjustments are made thoughtfully to ensure each student's strengths and learning journey are represented with accuracy and care.

We look forward to sharing the successes of the semester and continuing to support every child's unique pathway through learning.

At After School Care, we have focused on creating a warm, inclusive, and engaging environment where children can relax, learn, and enjoy themselves after a full day at school. Our program included a mix of indoor and outdoor play, creative activities, group games, and opportunities for quiet time and homework support.

Program Highlights:

- · Themed Activities: Reconciliation week
- Technology
- · Art

Outcome Reflection: Through these experiences, children showed curiosity and respect while learning about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories and cultures. They engaged thoughtfully in conversations, expressed their ideas through art, and demonstrated

growing awareness of the importance of inclusiveness and reconciliation. Children began to build a deeper sense of identity and connection to the broader community.

These activities support Outcome 2 by helping children:

- · Broaden their understanding of the world and the diverse communities within it
- · Develop empathy and respectful relationships
- · Special Events:

Technology Challenge Week: Focused on sustainability, where children created useful items from empty cupboard materials. (pictures below)

- · Outdoor Play: Daily outdoor sessions encouraged physical activity, teamwork, and social skills through organized games and free play.
- · Wellbeing Focus: We incorporated mindfulness activities, calming music, and reflection time into our routine to help children wind down and manage emotions.


